What is MAPPA and it's functions?

- Multi Agency Public Protection Arrangements
- A mechanism through which agencies can discharge their statutory responsibilities and protect the public in a co-ordinated manner
- Each of the 42 police areas in England and Wales have a MAPPA board.
- Identify all MAPPA offenders
- Share information safely and securely
- Risk assess offenders
- Risk manage offenders with suitable risk management plans.

Who are MAPPA offenders – Categories

■ Category 1

Registered Sexual Offenders: who are required to notify the police of their name, address and other personal details and inform of any subsequent changes

■ Category 2

Violent Offenders: Those who are sentenced to imprisonment or detention for 12 months or more, or detained under Hospital Order (mental health).

■ Category 3

Other Dangerous Offenders: Who do not qualify under Categories 1 or 2 but pose a risk of serious harm. A link between the offending and risk posed has been identified – these offenders require active multi agency management

How are offenders managed –MAPPA Levels

- **Level 1: ordinary management**

Will primarily involve one agency (Police, Probation, YOT or Prison Service)

- **Level 2: active multi agency management**

Risk management plans for these offenders require the active involvement of several agencies via regular MAPP meetings

- **Level 3: active multi agency management**

Similar to level 2 but these cases additionally require involvement of senior offices to authorise the use of special resources

Electronic Monitoring (EM) within MAPPA

- EM providers have a duty to co-operate and protect the public
- EM providers are made aware of MAPPA Offenders by Responsible Authority
- Attend regular MAPPA meetings:
 - Electronic Monitoring can provide an important control as part of a risk management plan
- MAPPA cases are handled by specialised operators
- May have an individual breach protocol
- Weekly compliance reports sent to Force Intelligence Bureau (FIB).
