

#### **PACE Sex Offender Services**







- A community based non-governmental organisation (NGO)
- Operates three separate services for people convicted of harmful sexual behaviour and who are classified as being of medium to high risk of reoffending
- They are:
- Safer Lives Treatment Programme
- Foothold Floating Support Service
- Circles of Support and Accountability (CoSA)
- All of these services are funded by the Probation Service





- Safer Lives is a treatment programme that runs three groups a week for 8 men per group
- Medium & high risk offenders (RM2000 and/or Stable 2007)
- Range of age and offence type in group (over 18)
- The programme runs on an interdisciplinary, co-facilitated model
- The groups have a rolling intake and last for approximately 14 months

### Safer Lives Treatment Programme





- Good Lives Model
- Desistance Theory
- Cognitive Behavioural Therapy / Schema Therapy
- Psychodynamic Theory
- Attachment Theory
- Systems Theory (Bio-Psycho-Social Approach)
- Groupwork Theory
- Relapse Prevention

## Theoretical underpinnings SL





- Provides intensive one to one support for men and women leaving prison
- The support offered is of a practical as well as emotional nature
- Assists the individual to reintegrate into the community
- Assists with the sourcing of suitable accommodation and day-time occupation
- Works with clients who have complex needs including intellectual disability, addiction, homelessness as well as the conviction for sexually harmful behaviour

## Foothold floating support service





- Two year pilot programme began in January 2015
- CoSA assists individuals who are medium to high risk of reoffending in their efforts to live a life free of crime and harmful behaviour.
- The CoSA model consists of an Inner Circle of 5-6 volunteers and Outer Circle of professionals working with the Core Member.
- The Circle will meet with the Core Member on a weekly basis for 12-14 months
- Volunteers recruited publicly, trained, screened and vetted, supervision and support provided
- Volunteers supports desistance by improving social and human capital by providing supporting the development of positive identity
- The Outer Circle includes the supervising Probation Officer & the Liaison Garda and other professionals working with the individual as part of the SORAM process

## Circles of Support & Accountability





- The function of a Circle is threefold:
- To provide moral and practical support for the Core Member
- To monitor the risk of the Core Member
- To hold the Core Member to account for current and future behaviour.
- Circles of Support and Accountability have been proven effective in international research in reducing the rate of recidivism in people classified as high risk of reoffending
  - 83% reduction in sexual recidivism.
  - 73% reduction in all types of violent recidivism, and an overall reduction of
  - 70% in all types of recidivism (including sexual and violent) in comparison to the matched offenders. (Wilson et al, 2009)
