

2000-2018

During these years all EU Member States joined the Foundation as patrons, alongside the UK and Scotland, consolidating the Academy's genuinely European character. ERA was one of the founders of the European Judicial Training Network (EJTN) in 2001.



1992

1992 was a historic year in the process of European integration: the European Single Market was completed, the Treaty on European Union was signed in Maastricht and the Academy of European Law was established in Trier.

... offers a forum for practitioners from different member states to exchange with one another and with the EU institutions.


... is the only EJTN member with a specifically European mission & remit.

- Partner of EU Institutions and agencies






ERA Events in 2024




Our mission


Particpants by funding type




ERA Journal
